

Transforming Challenging Clinical Gremlins: Reaching the People Beneath the Diagnosis

PRESENTER

Shawn Christopher Shea, M.D., is an internationally acclaimed workshop leader and educational innovator in the fields of suicide prevention, resiliency, clinical interviewing, and improving medication adherence, having given over 850 presentations worldwide. He is the Director of the Training Institute for Suicide Assessment and Clinical Interviewing (www.suicideassessment.com) and Adjunct Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at the Dartmouth Medical School in New Hampshire. Dr. Shea is the author of the best selling texts Psychiatric Interviewing: the Art of Understanding, 2nd Edition and The Practical Art of Suicide Assessment. His latest book, Improving Medication Adherence: How to Talk with Patients About Their Medications was chosen in 2009 for Doody's List of the 200 most important books in the field of medicine.

OVERVIEW

Session 1: Using philosophy as a tool for re-addressing the practical art of treatment planning, Dr. Shea pulls from his highly acclaimed book - Happiness Is - as well as his years of experience, to track down answers to two questions: What is the nature of happiness? and What is the nature of human nature itself? Using clinical examples, Dr. Shea demonstrates how the answer to these questions can be powerfully applied - an approach called "matrix treatment planning" - to a variety of clinical tasks, including the transformation of stalled treatment plans, creative client engagement, and suicide prevention.

Session 2: Next, Dr. Shea will focus on methods for uncovering problematic personality dysfunction. New life is given in the application of object relations theory to the initial assessment.

Session 3: Lastly, Dr. Shea will demonstrate specific interviewing techniques to help clinicians ferret out the earliest signs of impending psychosis or relapse as well as spotting dangerous psychotic processes, including suicide, homicide, and self-mutilation.

OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of the workshop, you will be able to:

- Apply the principles of "matrix treatment planning" to transform stalled treatment interventions.
- Use the human matrix model in suicide prevention and in building resiliency in both client and clinician.
- Describe the core theories of Kernberg and Kohut as they apply to the initial interview.
- Apply object relations theory to critical interviewing tasks.
- Utilize interviewing techniques for spotting delusional mood, delusional perception, and the life-cycle of a psychosis.
- Incorporate interviewing techniques to uncover dangerous psychotic processes.

This intermediate level workshop will be of interest to social workers, mental health counselors, psychologists, addiction counselors, therapists, care coordinators, and other mental health and human service professionals involved in conducting client interviews (assessments) and planning treatment with the people they serve.
